#### \*They count your best 6 subjects points wise\*



NEW CAO POINTS SYSTEM AND GRADES

$$H1 = 125 PTS$$

There is an additional 25 points added to every grade at Higher Level for Maths e.g.



H2 = 113 PTS

### BONUS POINTS FOR HIGHER MATHS

This applies the whole way down to a H6 but only at <u>Higher Level Maths</u>.

## LEAVING CERTIFICATE

Maths/English/Irish (Compulsory)

Pick four other subjects (Optional)

LCVP as an extra subject

Leaving Certificate points calculated from the best six subjects.

Higher and Ordinary level

# WHAT IS LCVP?

- 2 Year course over 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> year
- ► It is an eighth subject
- Don't have to pick subjects based around LCVP anymore
- Good subject to have if you are doing a number of OL subjects
- Maximum points 66

#### IF A STUDENT IS NOT REALLY SURE WHAT HE/SHE WANTS TO DO IN THE FUTURE:

#### PICK A BROAD RANGE OF SUBJECTS IN ORDER TO KEEP OPTIONS OPEN

MANY STUDENTS WILL CHANGE THEIR MINDS ABOUT THEIR FUTURE A NUMBER OF TIMES IN THE NEXT 2 YEARS • one language

- one science
- two subjects from the other options
- This combination would allow access into a broad range of courses/careers

DO I HAVE TO STUDY FRENCH? 3RD LANGUAGE?

- The entry requirement of a third language applies to a number of courses in a number of colleges (NUI's: UCD, UCC, NUIG, NUIM and its partner colleges).
- A third language as an entry requirement is not needed for DCU, UL, Trinity and all of the IT's/TU's
- Please check this and consider this carefully

#### CHOOSING A SCIENCE SUBJECT – BIOLOGY/ CHEMISTRY/ PHYSICS/ AGRICULTURE SCIENCE

#### Fees for TY are €380

If fees are paid for a course (for example TY) and a pupil subsequently changes their mind, those fees will not be lost, they will be transferred against other school fees or payments for that pupil.

### FEES FOR TY / 5<sup>TH</sup> YEAR

#### Take this process seriously and get it right the first time

- If you accept a position in TY and back out at a later date – every chance the subjects you are left with will be unsuitable
- If you look to switch subjects at a later date it may not work out well. After the deadline, WE WILL NOT ENTERTAIN REQUESTS FOR CHANGES.
- If you take up an extra subject outside of school you will still have to participate in all your subjects in school

## PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

#### Perhaps you don't feel ready, or you are too young to move onto the Leaving Certificate Programme.

TY will give you that extra year to mature, develop your potential and increase your self-confidence.

### Perhaps you have talents that you would like to explore and develop further and would like the time and space to do so.

TY will afford you with the time to do this without the pressure of the Leaving Cert.

Perhaps you want to develop a variety of new transferable life skills e.g. communication skills, presentation skills, organisation skills, research skills, IT skills, administration skills, interview skills etc.



THE ACTIVITIES OFFERED IN TY MAY EVEN HELP YOU TO REALISE SOME NEW TALENTS OR AREAS OF INTEREST

Work Experience (Fridays), Trips (Adventure/Educational/Fun), Gaisce Presidents Award, Guest Speakers, Road Safety Classes, Driving Campus, Film Making, Song Recording, Photography, Public Speaking, Microsoft Office Specialist Courses (MOS), Youth for Justice Competition (SVP), First Aid Training, Self -Defence, Swimming, Dance, GAA Coaching, Peer Education Programmes in Mental Health (Jigsaw), Sports Leaders Programme, RCNI Online/Onsite Courses, UNICEF Activism *Course, Certified Irish Angus Competition, Work* Experience Opportunities e.g. Defence Forces/Garda/Tara Mines, TY Stand *Up, Workshops: Team Building/Crime* Scene/Haircare/Beauty/Life Skills, Ice Skating, Belfast Trip.....and more!







### SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT

In TY you will:

Have the opportunity to bond with new people and form new friendships.

Improve relationships with teachers based on maturity and respect.

Get to work with new people e.g. course instructors, guest speakers etc.

Get to develop a working relationship with your employer and other colleagues during work experience.

Learn the importance of showing respect, making a good impression and the importance of teamwork in the workplace.



### EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

TY will allow you to become more confident in subjects and therefore be more likely to do Higher Level for the Leaving Cert.

TY will give you a year to sample many different subjects, therefore, helping you to make a more informed decision when choosing your Leaving Cert subjects.

TY will also give you the opportunity to improve in subjects you may have found difficult up to now, giving you a better foundation for the Leaving Cert at any level.

### VOCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Perhaps you still have no idea of the career area you wish to pursue.

TY will facilitate you to become familiar with adult and working life through the provision of work experience and career guidance.

Work Experience occurs <u>one day a week for</u> <u>the entire year (excluding December) and</u> <u>there is at least one week of block</u> <u>experience.</u>

STUDIES SHOW THAT **STUDENTS** WHO DO TY TEND 

Be more likely to take Higher Level subjects for their Leaving Cert and are less likely to change subjects or options in 5<sup>th</sup> year

Do better in their Leaving Cert, gaining at least 40 more points, and are less likely to repeat.

Have a better understanding of the world of work and can better map their career paths.

Take more responsibility for their own learning and decision making.

Have better self-management and time-management skills.

# HOW TO APPLY FOR A PLACE IN TY

Application forms will be made available to you via a text to your parents. In the online application form you will be required to elaborate on how TY will help you to improve your personal, social, educational and vocational development.

Do your own research to make your application stand out – have a look at TY.ie for plenty of information or talk to some of our own students who did TY. If you are serious about a place in TY (and places may be limited) your first step is a top class effort with your application form.

- Traditionally, at this time you need to be considering
  - Exam Payment (this has been waived by the DES)
  - Levels Forms (Paper version traditionally)
  - Changes to levels need to be sanctioned by the school.
  - If pupils drop a level for JC exams, they won't be doing Higher for Leaving Certificate.
  - Leave JC exams early, will be supervised in a room until exam is over
